## Notification of the Ministry of Public Health

Prescribing of General Waste Hauling Control Measures to Prevent Illegal Waste Disposal B.E.2560 (A.D.2017)

Whereas it is deemed expedient to prescribe general waste hauling control measures to prevent illegal waste disposal and for the benefits of controlling general waste hauling to disposal sites for appropriate disposal which shall not cause any impact to health, sanitation and environment.

By virtue of the provision of Clause 17 (2) of the Ministerial Regulation on Hygienic General Waste Management B.E.2560 (A.D.2017), the Minister of Public Health issues this Notification, as follows.

- Clause 1. This Notification shall be referred to as "Prescribing of General Waste Hauling Control Measures to Prevent Illegal Waste Disposal B.E.2560 (A.D.2017)".
- Clause 2. This Notification shall come into force one hundred eighty days following that of its promulgation in the Government Gazette.

Clause 3. In this Notification,

"general waste hauling" means transportation of general waste from its origin to a disposal site or from its origin to a waste transfer station by the organizations or persons described in Clause 4 of the Ministerial Regulation on Hygienic General Waste Management B.E.2560 (A.D.2017);

"general waste hauling agency" means the organizations or persons described in Clause 4 of the Ministerial Regulation on Hygienic Waste Management B.E.2560 (A.D.2017);

"general waste disposal agency" means the organizations or persons described in Clause 4 of the Ministerial Regulation on Hygienic Waste Management B.E.2560 (A.D.2017);

Clause 4. In general waste hauling, general waste hauling and disposal agencies shall prescribe general waste hauling control measures, as the case may be, to prevent illegal waste disposal, as follows.

- (1) In the case that general waste is directly transported from its origin to a disposal site or a transfer station, or general waste is transported from a transfer station to a disposal site, the general waste hauling agency shall need to record the weight of the waste delivered to the disposal site every time and provide a report for local officials within the 5<sup>th</sup> day of each month.
- (2) The general waste disposal agency shall need to provide a report indicating the waste weight accepted for disposal and submit it to the local officials responsible for the area in which the waste is originated and the area in which the disposal site is located within the 5<sup>th</sup> day of each month.
- (3) The general waste hauling agency shall need to provide waste hauling route tracking and control measures by using GPS (Global Positioning System) or other systems agreed by the local government.
